The meeting was presided over by Grand Master, M.III.Comp. Kessick John Jones, IX, in his usual warm and welcoming manner.

After the initial business of Grand Council had been completed the Deputy Grand Master, R.III.Comp. Paul Norman, IX, gave a heartfelt proposition of the re-election of the Grand Master which was seconded by R.III.Comp. Norman Milburn, G.P.C.W. This was received with due acclamation. The Grand Master gave a brief response to his re-election. He then reappointed as Deputy Grand Master, R.III.Comp. Paul Norman, IX and as Grand Principal Conductor of the Works, R.III.Comp. Norman Milburn, IX.

This being achieved, the Grand Master was delighted to confer Appointment to, or Promotion in, Grand Rank, on 159 Companions and invest those present.

The Grand Master then gave his address and was then extremely pleased to welcome representatives from around the World along with the heads of other Masonic Orders who were attending to give their usual support to the meeting.

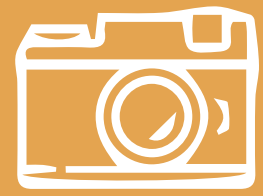
Thank you to all those who made such an effort to be present despite the transport difficulties on the London underground, and make it a very special occasion for their Companions and friends receiving Grand Rank.

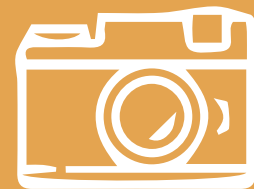
A host of hymns including "To be a Pilgrim" and a wonderful Choir and awe-inspiring music from the Cathedral organist were highlights of the day.

Mark Province of Worcestershire - Installation of Deputy and Assistant Grand Masters



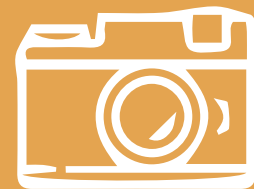
Due to the earlier than expected retirement of Deputy Provincial Grand Master, W.Bro. Paul A Yarnell, for family reasons, the Provincial Grand Master has appointed W.Bro. Mark J Winfield as Deputy Provincial Grand Master, and W.Bro. Mervyn C Cummings as Assistant Provincial Grand Master. We thank W.Bro. Paul for all his work and support during his years in Office. To facilitate the Installation of the Deputy and Assistant Prov.G.Ms designate, Eaton Lodge of M.M.M. No. 977 agreed to host Provincial Grand Lodge at their meeting on Friday, 17 April. Eaton Lodge was opened and the Provincial Director of Ceremonies, W.Bro. Stuart Cameron, entered and announced that the Provincial Grand Master (Prov.G.M.) and his escort of Provincial Officers requested entrance to the Lodge. One Candidate Completing All Three Ceremonies of the Orders of the Holy Sepulchre and of St. John the Evangelist



A meeting of St Mark Conclave No. 419, comprising Grand Officers of the Red Cross of Constantine, was held on Wednesday, 22nd April 2026, at Bridgend Masonic Hall. This was followed by the Ceremonies of the Appendant Orders, hosted by St Mark Conclave No. 419. The Conclave, which serves as the Grand Officers' Conclave for subscribing members within the South Wales and Monmouthshire Division of the Masonic and Military Order of the Red Cross of Constantine, was duly convened under its banner.

The meeting was opened by R. Ill. Kt. Nigel L. Angell, JP at 10am, in the absence of the Most Puissant Sovereign, Ill. Kt. Anthony P. Baker, who was unavoidably delayed in traffic. Given the importance of maintaining the schedule ahead of the Ceremonies of the Appendant Orders commencing at 11am, it was deemed necessary to proceed without delay.

Also present was the Deputy Intendant-General of the Division, V. Ill. Kt. D. Geraint Puw, Capt. G. Sep. Gd., P.G.H. Almoner, together with the Divisional Eusebius, Ill. Kt. Richard O. W. Edwards, P.G. Herald.

Other Divisional Officers in attendance included Ill. Kt. Barry J. Stubbings, P.G. Standard Bearer (L), Assistant Divisional Recorder; Ill. Kt. Stephen Waters, P.G. Prefect, Divisional Marshal; as well as Senior General Gordon Charles and Junior General Ralph Powell, to name but a few. They were joined by a goodly number of Grand and Divisional Officers, many of whom were to take office during the Ceremonies of the Appendant Orders. The agenda and domestic business of St Mark Conclave No. 419 having been almost completed, the Most Puissant Sovereign, Ill. Kt. Anthony P. Baker, arrived and assumed the Chair, proceeding to conclude the remaining business. The Conclave was then duly closed. The Right Reverend Prelate, Ill. Kt. Iain W. Sewell, a member of the Maurice Conclave NO. 446, then proceeded to open the Sanctuary. The sole candidate, W. Kt. Christopher J. Edwards, a member of the Hywel Dda Conclave, which meets in Porthcawl, duly perambulated the Sanctuary during each of the ceremonies.

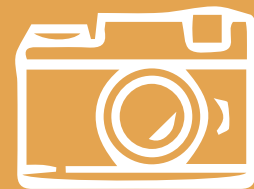

Having undertaken his solemn obligations, the traditional oration was delivered by the Seneschal, Ill. Kt. Anthony P. Baker. The candidate was thereafter acknowledged as a Christian Knight before retiring. A Sanctuary of the Second Point was then opened by the Prelate, V. Ill. Kt. Dr. Vivian Thomas, JP. The candidate was re-admitted and undertook the next part of the ceremony, after which the Allegorical Sequel was delivered by the Prior, Ill. Kt. Barry J. Stubbings. Having been entrusted with the signs and token, the candidate again retired.

The Commandery was then opened by R. Ill. Kt. Roy Leavers, K.C.C., Past Intendant-General of the Division of Surrey also a member of the Maurice Conclave NO. 446. The candidate was re-admitted, and the ceremony proceeded. The Commander then duly constituted the candidate as a Knight of St. John the Evangelist with the accolade and invested him with the sash and jewel. The newly installed Knight Companion was thereafter saluted by all Knights assembled, under the direction of P. Kt. Alan R. Hulbert, Acting Conclave Marshal, who discharged his duties with great aplomb and to the highest standard, ably assisted by his Deputy, Ill. Kt. Gary Crane.

All participants engaged in the ceremony conducted themselves to the highest possible standards, delivering the ritual with confidence and precision, without recourse to a ritual book and demonstrating a clear understanding of the subject matter. Angell, JP, then addressed the members, congratulating all participants on their performances and commending the high calibre of the ritual work and floor movements, which were of an exceptional standard, before the ceremony was concluded.

The proceedings were marked throughout by a strong sense of dignity, precision, and fraternal unity, reflecting great credit upon St Mark Conclave No. 419 and the Division as a whole. The successful completion of all three ceremonies by the candidate made the occasion particularly noteworthy, and it will undoubtedly be remembered as an excellent example of the high standards of ritual and organisation within the Order. The very convivial after-proceedings were held in the Great Hall of the Bridgend Masonic Building, where a repast of a very high standard, for which the Hall is well known, was served. Unity help out local young people

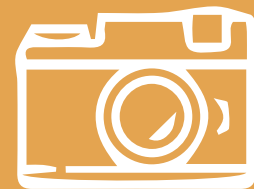

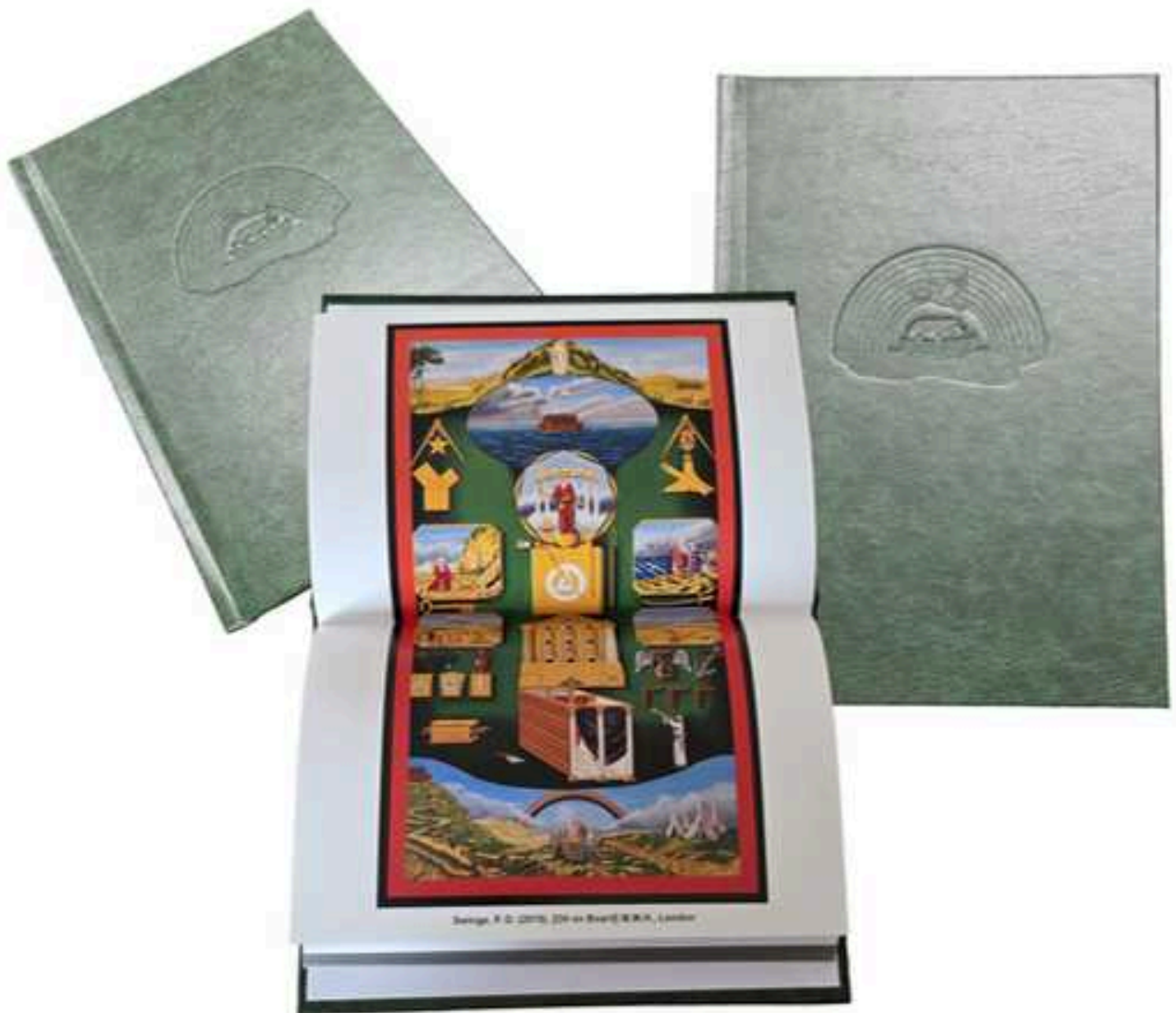
